## Revenues, ratios take a big hit

**R**EVENUE growth of just .4% in 2001 provides clear evidence that the US tank truck industry experienced what was probably its worst year ever. It certainly was the most dismal showing for tank truck carriers since the trucking industry as a whole was deregulated in 1980.

A one-two punch from a recessionary economy and soaring insurance rates left the tank truck industry on the ropes. The financial impact of falling revenues and dwindling profits was captured in *Modern Bulk Transporter's* 2001 Gross Revenue Report.

Tank truck carriers were already reeling from reduced shipments and constant downward pressure on chemical freight rates when the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks in New York City and Washington DC brought the US economy to a virtual standstill. Petroleum shipment volumes also slumped. Construction was one of the only economic bright spots for the tank truck industry.

Operating ratios provide some of the clearest evidence that insurance rate increases erased most of the profits that carriers had hoped to eke out last year. Soaring insurance premiums have become a crisis that is getting worse by the day. Many carriers have seen 100% increases in premiums, and terrorism coverage is excluded in many cases. A few carriers were saying last year that they were being quoted rates that were 200% to 300% higher than they were paying previously.

In a special report to the National Tank Truck Carriers membership, President Cliff Harvison warned in April 2002 that the worst is yet to come. "Carriers renewing after October 1, 2001 have seen premium increases averaging 130%, while those renewing after January 1, 2002 see hikes averaging 146%," he said. "The business reality is that tank truck carriers have no options beyond raising their own prices or adding on surcharges."

About 70% of the companies that were included in the *Modern Bulk Transporter* Gross Revenue Report were able to squeeze out some level of revenue increase. However, 94% reported that their operating ratios worsened. The top 10 tank truck carriers suffered along with all of the others. Only five of them posted higher revenues, and over half had operating ratios that were off from the previous year.

The difficulties of 2001 were too much for what had once been the largest US tank truck carrier. Matlack Systems Inc, which had been in the top 10 for well

over a decade, shut down after a lengthy decline. The end came in June 2001, when Matlack was broken up, and the parts were sold to several buyers, including Quality Distribution Inc and Superior Bulk Logistics Inc.

Aside from the Matlack sell-off, 2001 was a relatively quiet year for merger and acquisition activity. In one of the more significant deals, Enterprise Transportation Co acquired Boncosky Services Inc, a move that helped Enterprise climb into the ranks of the 100 Club (tank truck carriers with revenues above \$100 million). Twelve carriers are now in the 100 Club.

Looking at the top 10, Quality Distribution Inc reclaimed the top spot after a one-year absence. Trimac Transportation Services and The Kenan Advantage Group were two and three respectively. Rounding out the top 10 were Superior Bulk Logistics Inc, Bulkmatic Transport Co, Groendyke Transport Inc, Schneider National Bulk Carriers, A&R Transport Inc, Tankstar USA Inc, and The Dewey Corporation.

With combined revenues of \$2.1 billion, the 10 largest carriers accounted for 41.4% of the revenues in this report. A year earlier, the top 10 tank truck carriers had combined gross revenues of \$2.4 billion and accounted for 43.3% of the revenue total.

The top 25 carriers had \$3.24 billion in revenues, or 62.7% of the total represented in this report. This was a 1.6% decline from the 2000 report. The 50 largest carriers had revenues of \$4.2 billion, accounting for 83% of the total, compared with 82% in 2000.

Of the 125 carriers in this report, a quarter reported higher revenues in 2001 than in 2000. In contrast, three-fourths had revenues that were higher in 2000 than the previous year. About 24% were able to improve operating ratios, compared with 30% in 2000.

Total 2001 revenues for all carriers in this report were \$5,177,395,128. In 2000, those same carriers reported a combined total of \$5,157,105,259.

For the 125 carriers in this report, the average revenue for 2001 was \$41,419,161, down from \$41,927,685 in 2000. The median carrier on the list, the one with an equal number of carriers above and below it, had revenues of \$17,304,000. In 2000, the median carrier revenue was \$19,565,741.

Operating ratios for 2001 and 2000 were supplied for 117 of the carriers in this report. Twenty-eight showed improvement over the previous year, three less than in last year's Gross Revenue Report. The operating ratio represents operating expenses as a percentage of revenue.

Considering the difficulties faced by tank truck carriers in the past year, it's not surprising that a significant number of ratios are above 95%. Seventy-six carriers had operating ratios between 95.0% and 99.9%, the same as in 2000. The number of carriers with 100% ratios increased by eight in 2001 to 17. Twenty carriers posted ratios between 90.0% and 94.9%, a drop of 10 over the previous year. Just four had operating ratios below 90%, half that of 2000.

A majority of carriers in the report supplied tractor revenues, which give an indication of productivity levels. The average for

2001 was \$189,693. That was an impressive increase from the 2000 tractor revenue average of \$142,130. Eight of the top 10 reported tractor revenues, and their average was \$165,685. That was a 3.5% improvement over the previous year.

The highest revenue per tractor (\$294,977) was reported by one of the smaller East Coast chemical haulers. The lowest amount (\$76,656) came from a West Coast edibles carrier.

Eight tank truck carriers that emphasize chemical hauling had average revenue per tractor of \$177,118, close to the average for all tank truck carriers and above chemical carrier average in 2000. The average for chemical haulers in 2000 was \$154,699. Tractor revenues ranged from the high of \$294,977 to a low of \$49,478.

Average revenue per tractor for 10 petroleum transporters was \$166,520, an increase over the previous year when eight fleets reported \$162,867 for an average. The high for 2001 was \$260,299, while the low was \$83,158.

Seven dry bulk carriers posted average tractor revenues of \$151,621, a big improvement over the \$136,172 average achieved in 2000. Tractor revenues ranged from \$233,739 to \$89,000.

Five liquid and dry bulk fleets recorded average tractor revenues of \$109,607, a drop from the \$132,077 average in 2000. The high for the category was \$136,563, and the low was \$76,656.

Many of the figures here are from preaudited reports, and some may include nonbulk revenues or revenues from subsidiary tank truck carriers. In most cases, the figures were supplied directly to *Modern Bulk Transporter*. The editorial staff greatly appreciates the cooperation of all who helped in the preparation of this report. □
